


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



- **Shift:** Positioning HBCUs and PBIs as exemplars in higher education




Why Collaboration Matters



The Power of Collaboration

- Strategic Approach: Collaboration as a core strategy for strengthening online learning capacity
- Shifting Power Structures: Deemphasizing hierarchies, emphasizing peer partnership
- Collective Impact: Addressing shared challenges through inter-institutional cooperation

Centering the Community



- 166 HBCUs & PBIs
- 82 HBCUs & PBIs are QM members
- 38 HBCUs & PBIs are members of QM Systems or Consortiums

About the Initiative

- Partnership Model: Network created with institutions, not for them
- Quality Matters Support: Leveraging the gold standard for online quality assurance
- Community of Practice: Convening HBCU and PBI leaders for shared learning


About Quality Matters

- Quality Matters is the global organization leading quality assurance in online and innovative digital teaching and learning environments.
- Began in 2003 by faculty and institutions seeking to determine quality standards for online design.



- Bootstrapped into a nonprofit and a community of over 90,000 individual members worldwide.
- Centered around collaboration, collegiality, continuous improvement, and research.

What the Network Supports

- Decreasing Duplicative Services:
 Systems-level transformation through knowledge/resource sharing
- Expanding Resources: Collaborative approach prevents starting from zero
- Effective Ecosystem: Providing a model for sustainable partnership
- Institutional Autonomy: Reinforcing identity while building connections




