









OVERVIEW: GRADE SIGNALS




YELLOW FLAG SIGNAL

Students who earn "C" in an early term courses tend to persist but not graduate when compared to other courses taken in the same year.

In this English Composition and Rhetoric Course, students that receive a C are 94.4% likely to persist, but are only 52% likely to graduate, compared to an average graduation rate of 70%.

The graduation rate of students with a grade better than a C is 80%.





Data Science & Learning Pathways



98% of institutions in this study are losing more students above 2.0 GPA than below it.

This benchmark is based on a data set of 4 million students from 62 institutions.



An aggregate analysis of **over 1000** initiatives run by 55 unique institutions of varying size and sector has shown the following to date:

While advising services demonstrate the highest overall average lift in persistence, analysis shows that this is harder to do well, with only 71% of advising program analyses showing a statistically significant result.



Student participation in clubs, activities and organizations demonstrate the second highest average impact to date and is done well consistently. 100% of club-related analyses showed a statistically significant positive impact.



Tutoring services focused on writing skills demonstrate the third highest overall average lift in persistence, with 89% of analyses showing a statistically significant result.


