Top "Take-Aways" From My Course Review

#1—A clear, detailed syllabus is half the battle.

#2- Communication among the Review Team members is crucial.

#3-Keep an open mind regarding Review Team recommendations. Although it may seem like "nit-picking", the reviewers try to present options to improve your course.

#4-You WILL have ample time to make corrections/changes to your course (if needed).

#5 Designing and developing a quality course is time consuming. Try not to get offended if Review team members cannot "find" something within the course. This might mean that students will have trouble finding it as well!

#6-Most of all, have fun with course development. Once you have completed one successful review, the next one goes more smoothly. Even though you might feel like it is too much work to go through again, the second time around is much easier.

Any Peer Reviewer who does not successfully complete the required Rubric Update by November 30, 2014 will be required to reapply to become a peer reviewer and will need to meet current requirements of the role, including but not limited to, additional professional development.
